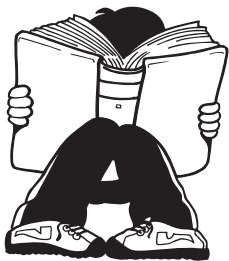
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OUR MISSION: Service and Leadership

The Santa Barbara County Education Office is an intermediate agency between the California State Department of Education and the 20 school districts that are located within the county's boundaries. K-12 enrollment for 2014 was 68,851 students.

It is our office mission to provide service and leadership in the areas of students, teachers, and finance.



Students:

82% of our budget provides classroom instruction and support to special populations of students.



Teachers:

We provide professional learning and support to teachers and administrators countywide.



Finance:

We provide business and information technology services to 20 school districts, two community colleges, one Joint Powers Agreement (JPA), and our own internal services department.

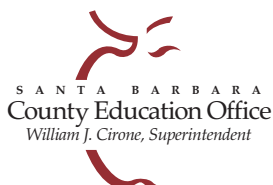
County Superintendent

FINANCIAL SERVICES:

Approve budgets for 20 school districts and one JPA

- 260 funds with revenues of \$789 million

Process payroll and vendor payments

- Approximately 132,192 payroll payments, totaling about \$476 million
- 77,272 vendor payments, totaling about \$295 million

Twenty districts are linked for data processing and information purposes

STUDENT SERVICES:

Special Education — The division provides education for certain students with disabilities, primarily:

- Special education students in districts with 900 or fewer pupils
- Children with severe disabilities
- Preschool or infant children with disabilities
- Children with disabilities in juvenile court and community schools
- Children with low incidence disabilities including deafness and blindness

More than 1,100 students at over 300 sites receive services, including:

- Direct classroom or supplemental instruction
- Speech and language services
- Instruction for students who are deaf, hard-of-hearing, or visually impaired
- Occupational and physical therapy
- Adapted physical education
- Group or individual counseling
- Nursing services

Other educational programs and services:

- **Child Development Programs and Early Education Programs**
 - Early education, child care, and support services for 5,000 children and their families.
 - Includes: California Alternative Payment Program, CalWORKS Stage 2 and 3 Child Care, State Preschool Centers, Main Learning Infant/Toddler Center, California School Age Families Education Center, Child Care Food Program, Health Linkages Program, and Santa Barbara Child Care Planning Council
- **Children's Creative Project** provides arts education programs through resident artist workshops and multi-cultural performances for 50,000 students
- **Transitional Youth Services (TYS)** for homeless and foster youth provides educational services and support to nearly 9,000 children experiencing homelessness and over 500 foster youth each year
- **Juvenile Court and Community Schools serve some 160 students in:**
 - Court Schools at Santa Maria Juvenile Hall and Los Prietos Boys Camp
 - Community School in Santa Maria
- **Migrant Education** serves about 2,160 migrant students and their families
- **Nurses and psychologists**
- **Regional Occupational Program (ROP)/ Career Technical Education (CTE)**
 - Career preparation training that serves more than 3,500 high school juniors and seniors and out-of-school youths yearly
- **Volunteer Coordination Program (Partners in Education and North County Volunteer Corps)** recruits, screens, and places volunteers in schools countywide. Volunteers contribute over 30,000 hours of service annually to students

TEACHER AND ADMINISTRATOR SERVICES:

Credential services, Preliminary Administrative Services Credential Program (PASC), and Clear Administrative Services Credential Program (CASC)

Curriculum Council provides up-to-date information on the latest state and national policy, research, legislation, and practice

Educational Technology Services. Through the SBCEO portal (sbceoportal.org), we supply:

- More than 5,000 educational web-streaming videos as well as DVDs
- Audiovisual support for events
- School and website hosting

Peer Assistance and Review Program (PAR)

Professional development (PD) and technical assistance, customized professional learning, and programs for teachers and administrators to support the improvement of student learning

Teacher support and recognition programs including competitive grants, recognition events, and the County Teacher of the Year program
